<u>What is Diamond</u> <u>Baseball?:</u>

Diamond Baseball of Boulder, Inc. is a non-profit organization started in the mid 90s. We are, officially, a 501(c) 3 organization according to the IRS. We are recognized as tax exempt by the City of Boulder and we are registered with the Colorado Secretary of State. Contributions are tax deductible!

What do we do?

We organize and field teams that play competitive baseball. We have teams for those 13 and under, 14 and under (Boulder Bison) and we field American Legion Baseball teams, in the A, B, and C divisions. We are big supporters of Boulder High School's Baseball program, however the BHS High School Season is entirely separate from our organization.

DBOB Philosophy:

It is all about competitive baseball and providing opportunity for kids who want to play and learn the game. We are striving to build an organization that will provide a lasting legacy in terms of baseball programs and facilities from the youth level to the High School Level and American Legion A level. We want to teach baseball fundamentals and the love of the game. We want to bring baseball back into our social fabric of our community where an evening at a game is an enjoyable community and neighborhood event. We want the kids and the fans to have fun! We will provide a base program that feeds Boulder High School and our American Legion program and wins state championships! How will we do this and what have we done so far? Read on.

<u>It's A Whole New Ball</u> <u>Game:</u>

While the major leagues are contemplating contraction with the elimination of the Twins and the Expos, Diamond Baseball is busting at the seams by adding a second 13-year-old team this year. Diamond Baseball is moving in the right direction. The Diamond Baseball Board has been meeting every two weeks since October. Our board meetings are standing room only! Since October, our meetings have been extremely well attended with an overall attendance record of 95%. We are setting goals, meeting deadlines, and getting things done. Under the leadership of Rick Thomas, our organization is exploding with energy. Our Board meeting attendance and ability to get things done is not by happenstance; it's due in large part to our president, Rick Thomas. Rick has applied his business savvy and managerial skills to Diamond Baseball. Being a bit of a bulldog, Rick is turning our organization into a first class outfit. It's fun being involved in an organization that gets things done.

The Board has identified key issues to focus on; they include expanding our board and establishing an identity and formal goals and objectives

Identity:

If you were to ask anybody in Boulder who Diamond Baseball is, you would probably get a puzzled look followed by, "Isn't that the sports-jewelry outlet that Tom Shane started a few years back?" Everybody knows who the Boulder Bison are and have heard of Legion Baseball, but few people are aware that Diamond Baseball is the parent organization for both these programs. It is critical that people know who we are and what we do, if we are to succeed.

Fundraising

Did you know that it costs \$10-13,000 per year to field a Bison or Legion team? In simple terms that equates to nearly \$1000 per player. The fees we charge our players pays for less than half the costs! Through fundraising, personal donations, and sponsorships Diamond Baseball has been supplementing our player's fees to the tune of over \$500 per player per year. Previous reserves have been nearly drained. President Rick Thomas, realized that we are headed for a collision course with "insufficient funds" if we don't start attacking this problem. As the first order of business, Diamond Baseball has initiated several fundraising programs, including concessions at Invesco Fields, baseball clinics, selling of Krispy Cream Doughnuts, and sponsorship programs. In addition, the board has approved and published an itemized budget for each

team. Being financially secure is our single most important goal for 2002.

Building Bridges:

While there is usually an adversarial relationship between the Bison program and Little League because we often compete for the same players, (just ask South Boulder Little League and the South Boulder Bulldogs), Diamond Baseball has extended the olive branch. In an unprecedented move, Marlin Bohn (past NBLL President) and Mary Kennedy (current NBLL President) and our board have been working together for the good of both organizations. Kudos on our side to Eric Harman who has worked very hard for both organizations. NBLL and DBOB have teamed up to lobby the City of Boulder to build 6 new baseball fields at Valmont City Park. Diamond Baseball is putting on the first ever "Early-Bird Baseball Clinic" on February 23 for North Boulder Little Leaguers. The success of Boulder High School Baseball ultimately depends on the strength of the Diamond Baseball program, which ultimately depends on North Boulder Little League. Working together, both programs will grow for the betterment of all kids.

Equipment: The Boulder Bison and the Boulder Legion programs have always had first class uniforms and equipment but with escalating costs even these items are being threatened. It is critical that we have better control of our uniforms and equipment. The Diamond Baseball Board has assigned one person dedicated to the tracking and coordination of all uniforms and equipment. Enter, Craig Ansbaugh. Craig has stepped up to the plate and inventoried all our existing uniforms and equipment, and has been negotiating with our vendors to get the best possible prices on all future purchases. Thank you, Craig for taking on this daunting task.

Coaching Announcements!

The Bison 14 year old team will be coached by Dennis Nickerson. There will be two Bison 13 year old teams; one head coach will be Phil Swan while the other will be a new addition to Diamond Baseball, Benjamin (B.J.) Otten. BJ responded to our advertisement for coaching help last fall and was interviewed by Jack and Rick and Phil. BJ brings a lot of enthusiasm to the program and he has great baseball experience. He graduated from Middlebury College in Vermont with a degree in biology. BJ competed in high school baseball, soccer, And Nordic Ski Jumping. He has been playing baseball since he was five in both summer leagues and school.
